The data from 2019 shows 83.3% of all local events registered had an attendance of 80 or under.

The data from 2018 shows 79.33% of all local events registered had an attendance of 80 or under.

Therefore, over the last two years **81.3%** of all local events could utilise one start within a two-hour start window as suggested within the guidance.

The data from 2019 shows **60.95%** of all regional events registered had an attendance between 1 and 160. 64 of 105 events that took place.

The data from 2018 shows **59.04%** of all regional events registered had an attendance between 1 and 200. 62 of 105 events that took place.

Therefore, over the last two years **60%** of all regional events could utilise two starts within a two-and-a-half-hour start window as suggested within the guidance.
